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KEYNOTE ADDRESS - DR. MARK EDWARDS

Our superintendent of schools, [Susan Allen](#), challenged us to rethink how technology is used for instruction in our district. She wanted us to see and learn from some of the best schools in the nation, and decided we should visit some of the schools included in the [National School Boards Association \(NSBA\) annual Technology Education Site Visits](#). These schools are chosen by the NSBA for their thoughtful and successful approaches to integrating technology.

The first district we visited was [Vancouver Public Schools](#) during the 2012-13 school year. We saw firsthand how instructional technology had permeated the classrooms in this district and learned about the impressive work of the [Project Red](#) consortium. It was also here that we first heard about the work being done in Mooresville, NC. We contacted Mooresville and asked if we could visit, and they put us on their waiting list. A year and a half later (yes, the waiting list is that long) it was our turn to visit.

After our visit we learned that everyone who visits the [Mooresville Graded School District](#) seems likely to say the same thing: “We went to see their technology integration and left talking about their culture.” This district has created a blueprint for what they call [digital conversion](#) and is willing to share everything. It was the inspiration for our own journey down this path, and is now energizing other districts that have visited us to learn about it.

Dr. Mark Edwards is the former Superintendent of the [Mooresville Graded School District](#) and the chief architect of the *digital conversion* that has transformed that district. He is the author of [Every Child, Every Day](#) and [Thank You for Your Leadership: The Power of Distributed Leadership in a Digital Conversion Model](#), and he is the 2013 National Superintendent of the Year.

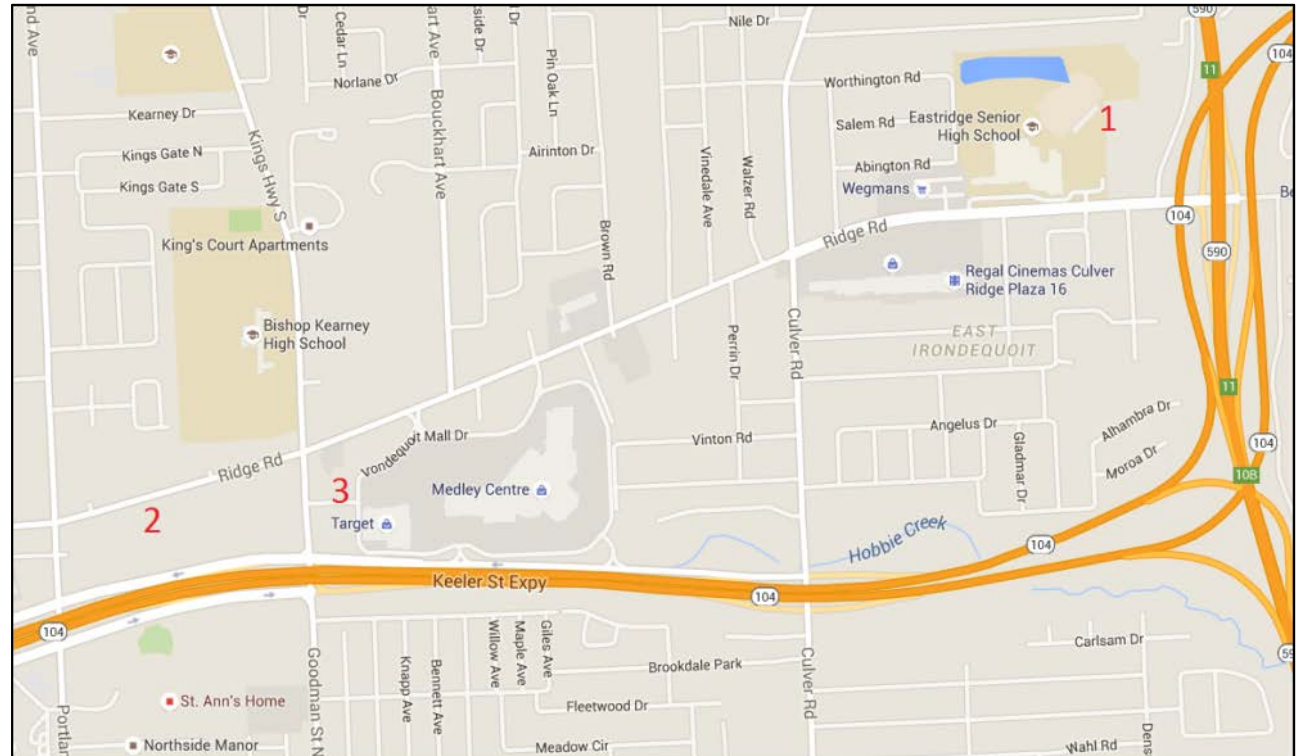
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HOTEL INFORMATION

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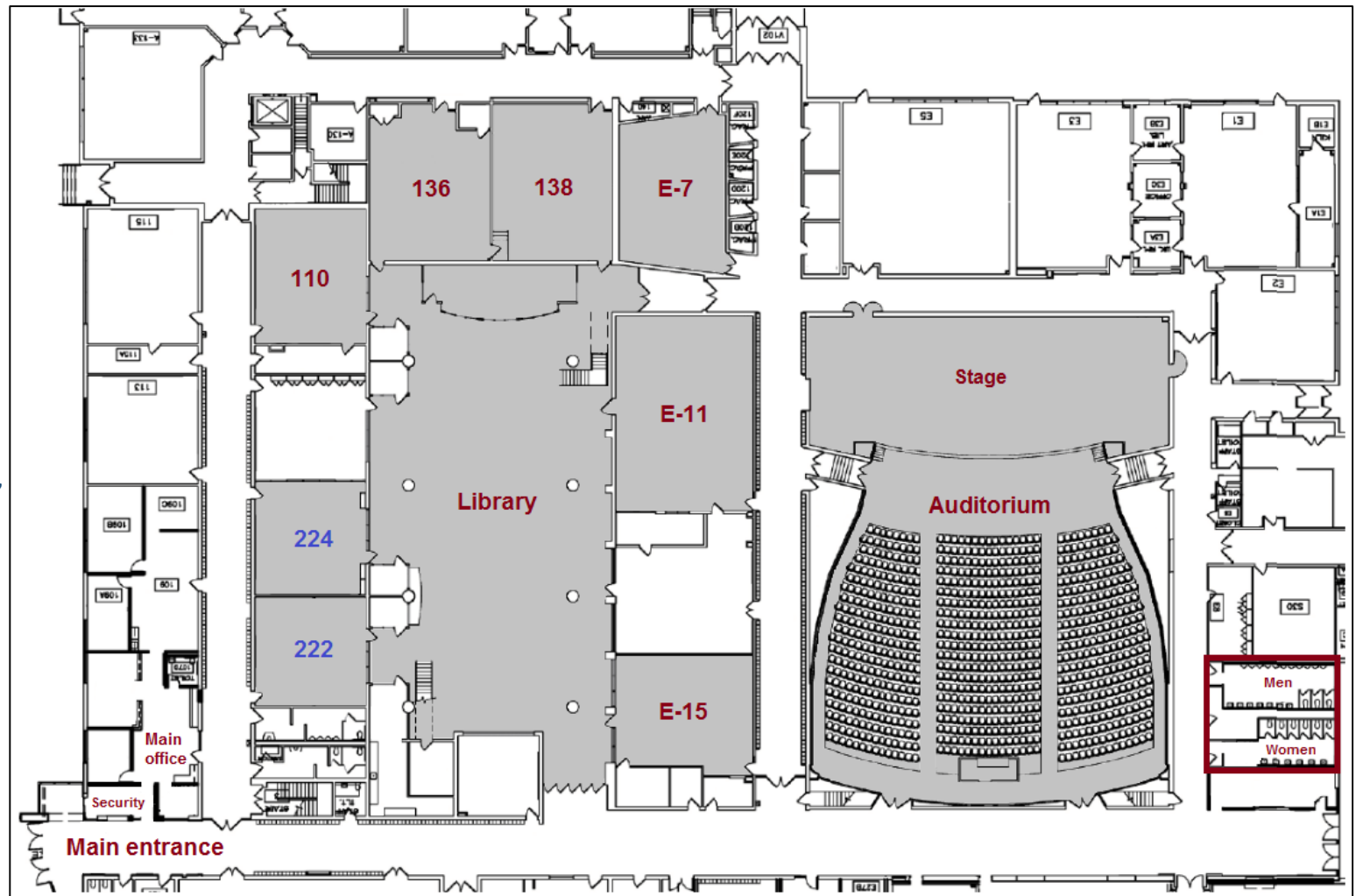
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SYMPOSIUM FLOOR PLAN
